Where to find us

Hardwick Park is in Sedgefield, County Durham on the A177 Durham-Stockton road, 2½ miles from A1(M) junction 60.

Access

The majority of the paths around the park are well surfaced and generally flat. Wheelchairs are available for free hire from the visitor centre.

Water Safety

Due to areas of deep water, please do not enter any of the lakes and ponds within the park. Steep slopes are present around water edges so please take care when using wheeled equipment (e.g. pushchairs, wheelchairs, bicycles). Children must be supervised at all times and dogs should not be allowed to swim during icy periods.

Dogs

Dogs are welcome but must be kept on a lead between the hours of 9am-6pm and at all times during bird nesting season.

Admission


It is free to enter the park however there are pay and display car parking charges. Annual parking permits are also available. All money raised from parking charges goes directly into the maintenance and development of the park.
