

# Pupil Place Planning in Durham Schools and Academies 2023



November 2023

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## **SECTION 1: Introduction**

All children and young people should benefit from an education that helps them succeed in life and allows them to make the most of their skills and employment opportunities. We want pupils and young people to live healthy, active and fulfilling lives, and for our nurseries, schools and colleges to provide them with the skills to make good choices about their life and wellbeing. Furthermore, it is our aim that all children and young people should feel safe and confident in their education.

Durham County Council (the local authority) has a statutory duty to ensure that there are sufficient school places in the right locations to meet demand. We are responsible for promoting a good supply of strong schools through planning, organising and commissioning places in a way that raises attainment, increases diversity, encourages collaboration between schools and promotes community cohesion. We seek to achieve this in partnership with key stakeholders including headteachers, governors, academy trusts, parents and carers, Dioceses and local communities.

The need for school places fluctuates in response to population changes, new housing developments and government policy and can lead to rising as well as decreasing pupil numbers. Increases in demand can lead to the establishment of new schools or the expansion of existing schools. Decreases in demand can lead to a reduction in places through changes to admission arrangements or the rationalisation of provision. This document sets out the council's approach to Pupil Place Planning and outlines our approach to the organisation of schools to maintain and improve education provision across the county. It also provides an overview of current and future pupil numbers which supports planning the future pattern and provision of school places across the County.

The purpose of the Pupil Place Planning document is to understand the projected demand for school places in the future. Any reviews of education provision we undertake and any recommendations for school re-organisation (for example opening, closing, federating, amalgamating, enlarging or contracting of schools) will, in part, be based on information contained in this document.

Pupil Place Planning (PPP) is a critical aspect of the Local Authority's statutory duty to assess the local need for school places to ensure that every child can be provided with a place in a state-funded school in County Durham. This document seeks to provide a comprehensive account of trends in pupil numbers and likely upcoming pressures, drawing on a variety of data sources which are referred to in Section 4. Information on current and projected school rolls, school capacity, birth rates and planned housing developments is provided throughout the document. However, future pupil numbers, particularly in individual areas of the county and in individual schools, may be affected by unanticipated changes to planned local housing targets, changing migration patterns and swings in parental preference and are not always possible to predict with total accuracy.

An updated PPP document is made available to schools and key stakeholders each year. Schools are encouraged to play an active role in the pupil place planning process and to identify at an early stage any concerns with projections that may impact on future school planning.

In mainstream school forecasting, the county is split into 'planning areas' for both primary and secondary sectors. This allows for a more detailed analysis of need and helps to make decisions about the allocation of funding to provide additional places to meet demand. Planning areas do not have geographical boundaries, but are groups of schools that reflect the local geography, reasonable travel distances and existing pupil movement patterns. Primary planning areas are listed in Annex 1 (pages 14-15). Tables of primary school projected rolls are detailed in Annex 2 (pages 16-39) and are presented using the planning area groupings highlighted in Annex 1. Secondary schools are also grouped into specific local school place planning areas. Tables of secondary school projected rolls are highlighted in Annex 3 (pages 40-44).

## **SECTION 2: The National Picture (England) 2022**

Nationally the pattern of demand for pupil places in England is changing. In October 2023 the Department for Education (DfE) released its most recent set of national pupil projections. The key points are:

- The population attending primary and nursery schools peaked in 2019 and the figures have been dropping since then. This is primarily due to the continued reductions in the birth numbers since 2013, although there was a larger drop in the population in 2021 which may have been connected to the pandemic (for example, parents choosing to home school for reception year). Figures for the 2 years since then have been stable but are expected to drop from 2024 onwards.
- The overall population in state funded nursery and primary schools is projected to be 4,180,930 in 2028. This is circa 412,000 lower than the population in 2023 (4,592,000.) The actual figure for 2028 is 116,000 higher than was forecast in the model published in 2022, a difference of 2.9%.
- The peak in the secondary school population is still projected to be in 2024-2025, followed by a gradual drop to the end of the projection period.
- The secondary school population is projected to be 3,191,000 in 2028. This is 2,000 lower than the total in 2022 (3,193,000). This figure for 2028 is 28,000 higher than was forecast in the model published in 2022, a difference of 0.9%.

In the last decade national policy has been principally focussed on addressing a shortage of primary places as a result of increasing birth rates. The government has aimed to address such shortages primarily through supporting the opening of Free Schools, expansions of Academy Trusts and supporting local authority plans for the expansion of successful and popular primary schools. This focus is now shifting to the secondary schools as these increased numbers of primary pupils are moving into the secondary sector.

## **SECTION 3: The Position in County Durham**

County Durham has had the fourth largest population increase out of the 12 north east authorities since 2001. Between 2001 and 2020 the population increased by 39,500 to 533,100 which is an increase of 8%. In the north east the average increase was 5%. These latest figures also show that County Durham's population has continued to grow each year since 2003.

Unlike the national trend the county has seen a gradual fall in the number of its children and young people since 2001. The 2020 figure was 4.2% lower than in 2001 compared to a 8.5% increase nationally. This represents a fall of 4,500 children and young people in the county over this period. The fall in the 10-14 year old age group is due to low birth rates between 2000-2003 although increases in births between 2004 and 2012 did increase the number of children aged under 10. However, this trend has now reversed as birth rates have fallen since 2021 and are now as low as those at the time of the 2001 Census.

The expected intake to reception is expected to fall from 4,975 in 2022/23 to 4,641 by 2026/27, followed by a relatively sharp increase in 2027/28 to 4,923. Thereafter they are expected to increase by approximately 30 each year up to 2031. Overall primary school pupil numbers are projected to reduce by approximately 2,400 between 2022/23 and 2029/30 before starting to increase slightly thereafter.

Secondary school pupil numbers (age 11-16) are projected to increase each year from 2022/23 – 2025/26 so that by 2025/26 there are approximately 1,400 more secondary pupils aged 11-16 than there are in 2022/23. Thereafter they are expected to reduce slightly year on year so that by 2030/31 they are at the same level as in 2022/23.

At 1 September 2023 the capacity of the 211 primary/infant/junior schools was 46,338 and 37,118 children were on roll. This means there was an overall surplus of 9,220 places (19.9%). The 11-16 capacity of the secondary schools was 30,699 and there were 27,369 pupils on roll. This gives an overall surplus of 3,330 (10.84%).

### **Promoting Choice and Diversity**

The 2006 Education and Inspections Act requires Local Authorities to exercise their functions with a view to securing diversity in the provision of schools and increasing opportunities for parental choice.

Promoting and achieving choice and diversity in our school system is a way of creating a climate which fosters high and improving standards of achievement. There is diverse provision in Durham including Federations and Foundation (Trust) Schools, Academies, as well as Voluntary Aided/Controlled Roman Catholic and Church of England Schools and Community Schools and a University Technical College. The pattern of school provision as at 1 September 2023 is below.

## SECTION 4: Forecasting Primary and Secondary Pupil Numbers

Pupil projections are used for a number of purposes. These include:

- Pupil place planning.
- To help complete the annual Department for Education (DFE) school capacity return.
- To help calculate Section 106 contributions from new housing developments for additional school places.
- To assist with determining future published admission numbers (PANS) and school re-organisation proposals.
- To plan and review the pattern and provision of schools across the LA area which helps inform the Education Review.

Pupil projections in County Durham are based on relevant data produced from a range of services:

- Health authorities (live births).
- October School Census.
- Primary school patterns of transition to secondary schools.
- Neighbouring Authorities (transfer of information regarding pupil movement across borders and school re-organisation proposals).
- Additional pupils arising from housing developments that have received planning permission.
- Early Years settings - nursery/childcare figures (private/voluntary/LA provision).
- Staying on rate at Post-16.

Pupil rolls in primary schools are projected by using data provided by the Health Authority on the number of children born in County Durham. The data includes a postcode sector and the academic year a child was born. Future years' births are assumed to be an average of the previous 5 years'.

Forecasting secondary school pupils is carried out at the same time as forecasting primary numbers. Primary numbers feed through to the secondary phase, so current projections have the advantage that seven year groups are already in the school system.

The basic technique for forecasting secondary pupil numbers is to project forward the numbers of children transferring to secondary schools from specific primary schools each year. These figures are then adjusted to include a range of other important factors.

The key factors are:

#### ▪ **Expected House Building**

Accurately predicting the number of pupils likely to be produced from housing developments is not straightforward as it depends upon the location, type of housing etc. In August 2023 DfE produced information on pupil yields using national data. This detailed research indicates that the expected pupil yield from developments is as follows:

- 0.26 primary aged pupils per house (i.e. just under 3 houses could typically generate one primary aged pupil);
- 0.13 secondary aged pupils per house (i.e. just under 10 houses could typically generate one secondary aged pupil);
- 0.07 early years/nursery aged pupils per house (i.e. 100 houses could typically generate 7 early years/nursery aged pupils);
- 0.02 post 16 aged pupils per house (i.e. 100 houses could typically generate 2 post 16 aged pupils);
- 0.01 SEND pupils per house (i.e. 100 houses could typically generate 1 SEND pupil).

The impact of new house building is often discussed during consultation on any proposed re-organisation of schools. House building does not necessarily mean additional pupils overall - people buying new houses may be moving from other areas within the Authority with knock-on effects on other schools. There are many instances where families move house but the children do not change the school they attend. The effects of regeneration schemes or housing market renewal schemes are very difficult to predict.

Housing developers regularly submit applications for schemes across the county. The impact of additional housing on the availability of school places is carefully considered and where additional teaching accommodation is required, the developer will be requested to make a financial contribution to the cost.

#### ▪ **Migration Trends**

Migration trends take account of the additional numbers of children expected to move in or out of a particular area or neighbouring authority and the arrival of new



migrants from abroad. According to the latest data, less than 2% of our primary school pupils are resident in other authorities and about 2.5% of our resident population go to schools outside of the authority for their education. Taking account of all nationalities of children in the LA area, English is the first language of approximately 96.3% of primary children.

In respect of secondary schools, about 2.9% of pupils travel in from other authorities, but around 4.9% go to schools outside of the Authority for their education. English is the first language for approximately 96.8% of secondary children.

#### ▪ **Changes in School Organisation**

Recent or planned changes in the number, size, age range and location of schools has an impact on pupil place planning. Pupil place planning takes account of proposed changes to the current pattern and provision at primary age, 11-16, post 16 and provision in special schools.

#### ▪ **Schools' Popularity**

Parental preference and admissions into schools is monitored and reviewed each year to identify any significant changes that could impact on projecting pupil numbers for both primary and secondary schools.

#### ▪ **Surplus Places**

Schools tend to operate most efficiently when full or nearly full. However, it is generally accepted that not all unfilled places in a school are surplus places, but that a small margin of surplus capacity is often allowed to facilitate parental preference, to take account of the fact that schools with available places may not always be in the part of a planning area where the demand is, and to allow for a degree of error in the forecasts. A school is generally considered to be full when it has less than 5% of its places unfilled. This is in line with the National Audit Office report on Capital Funding for new school places published in 2013, where it states: "It is considered that on average 5 per cent was the bare minimum needed for authorities to meet their statutory duty with operational flexibility, while enabling parents to have some choice of schools". Therefore, local authorities cannot and should not try to eliminate all surplus capacity. A certain level of surplus places is necessary because:

- it allows greater opportunity to respond to parental choice;
- there may be unpredicted changes to demographic patterns, with a sudden influx of children to particular areas;
- there may be unexpected changes to house building patterns.

There is no single 'ideal' level of overall surplus capacity since this varies from authority to authority. It is reasonable to aim for between 5% - 10% overall surplus across the authority. Patterns show that a reasonable figure for urban areas is around 5% whereas in more rural areas it is around 10%. As Durham has a number of rural areas the aim is to work to a target of no more than 10% surplus places overall. It is recognised that in some rural areas in County Durham it may be difficult to achieve this target. However, where an individual school has 25% or more surplus places, the Local Authority may take action to reduce this if it

is appropriate to do so with the aim of improving that school's educational and financial sustainability.

Removing surplus places is not an end in itself. It must be part of the wider strategy to improve outcomes for children and young people through transforming learning and so raising education achievement.

## **SECTION 5: Strategy for School Organisation**

This strategy sets out an approach to school organisation to ensure there are sufficient places to meet demand and to support school leadership teams and Governing Bodies to provide the highest possible quality of education to children in County Durham. As highlighted in Section 1, the county has been 'broken down' into specific school place planning areas for both primary and secondary schools to assist with pupil place planning and school organisation. The council looks at these local school place planning areas as well as the whole county to ensure that schools are appropriate to deliver an effective education to their local communities.

There are many factors that should be considered carefully before any proposals for re-organisation of schools in an area can be brought forward with a clear rationale that demonstrates how the outcome of any changes would lead to enhanced education provision for children in the relevant local school place planning area.

The main emphasis on school provision should be focussed on the standard of education, but the overall strategy needs to take into account the wider provision in an area and financial sustainability is also a key factor. Significant factors that need to be carefully considered in any review of individual schools and groups of schools within each pupil place planning area would include:

- (a) education standards;
- (b) Ofsted judgements;
- (c) current and projected pupil numbers;
- (d) geographical location, including remoteness of a school from other schools;
- (f) evidence of financial difficulties being experienced by a school, including capacity to appoint a Head teacher;
- (e) strength of Governance and Leadership at schools;
- (g) transport arrangements and implications on cost of any changes;
- (h) the school's projected budget position over a five year period (including the impact of the proposed School National Funding Formula);
- (i) expected house building in a local area that will require the need for additional school places;
- (j) condition of school buildings;
- (k) community involvement.

With the educational landscape changing rapidly, particularly with the increase in the number of Academies and Free schools, uncertainty about school funding, opening of 'all through' schools, school 'campus' arrangements etc. there is a range of different options for education provision that could be considered now, that may not have been considered in the past.

There is a clear need to consider potential for different patterns of educational provision in some local school place planning areas in County Durham to address some/all of the factors highlighted (a-k above). It is essential that schools and all

relevant partners and key stakeholders are involved from the early stages in any review of educational provision. In most instances there may be a range of options that need to be considered and therefore it is essential that schools are fully involved in discussing long term plans for their own schools as early as possible.

### **Providing Additional School Places**

Additional school places can be provided by either adapting current accommodation to create additional teaching space or by building additional classrooms subject to the availability of capital funding. In some instances of significant growth in a local area there may be the need to provide a new build additional school.

Local Authorities receive Basic Need grant funding from the Government to provide additional school places. Funding for County Durham is grossly insufficient to provide all of the additional places required and other sources of funding are therefore required to enable the Council to fulfil its statutory duty of ensuring there are sufficient school places available.

Where there is a need for additional school places as a result of new housing developments, one potential source of funding is a financial contribution from housing developers via a Section 106 agreement. There is an approved methodology for seeking contributions from housing developers for additional teaching accommodation. Sometimes, capital receipts from the sale of school land can be used, however this is subject to DfE approval about the disposal of school buildings and playing fields.

### **School leadership**

School leadership teams and Governing Bodies face increasing pressures to maintain the efficient organisation and effective leadership of their schools, particularly of rural primary schools, with regard to:

- recruiting headteachers
- developing alternative models of school leadership
- creating effective partnerships between schools.

Within this challenging context, building leadership capacity and succession planning is an issue that must be part of any Governing Body's strategic planning. The local authority works with Governing Bodies to develop strategies to build capacity and to plan well in advance for strong, sustainable future leadership of a school. It is vital that this is approached and managed in a forward thinking and proactive manner and not in response to the resignation or retirement of a headteacher. The local authority supports Governing Bodies to take a strategic approach to the challenge of developing a model of leadership that will suit their school in the future. This includes exploration of the suitability of executive headteacher arrangements as part of a collaboration, federation or Multi Academy Trust (MAT).

## **SECTION 6: Post-16, SEN and Early Years Education**

### **Post-16 Pupil Place Planning**

Post-16 learner numbers can be difficult to predict as they are influenced by a number of key factors including:

- Continued increases in the 16 year old cohort. The 16 year old cohort for 2024 is 5,586. This is a 6.6% increase on the previous year's cohort size.

It is expected that the numbers in the 16 year old cohort will continue to increase to 5,882 by 2027.

- Quality of CEIAG programmes and activities within secondary schools.
- Export of County Durham learners to provision in other LA areas alongside import of out of county learners in to County Durham learning provision.
- Longer term impacts from COVID-19 pandemic on numbers and proportions of post 16 students continuing in further education or training compared to entering the labour market.

As a result of Raising of the Participation Age (RPA), young people are required to remain in learning until their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday. This doesn't necessarily mean staying in school. Young people will be able to choose how they participate post-16, which could be through: full time education such as school, college or otherwise; an apprenticeship or job with accredited training; part time education or training if they are employed, self-employed or volunteering for 20 hours or more a week.

The current participation rate of 16 year olds resident in County Durham is 93.2% and is based on the 2022/23 December-February average (which is the period within the academic year that the Department for Education uses for annual comparisons e.g. NEET scorecard). The participation rate is a measure of the percentage of 16 year old Durham residents whom the local authority has recorded as either attending a School Sixth Form, Further Education Provision (College of Work Based Learning Provider), are in an Apprenticeship or have a job or voluntary place/internship with accredited training or part time study.

There are a range of learning providers in County Durham. Information on learning providers including school sixth forms/sixth forms college, further education colleges and independent training providers can be found on the Families Information Service website.

### **Important Note:**

Participation data included in the above report relates to young people who are resident in County Durham and recorded on the Local Authority's Client Caseload Information System (CCIS).

Population projections are based on data sourced from the school census information and Year 11 predictions.

### **SEN Provision**

When planning places for Children and Young People who require Specialist provision we work with all Special and Enhanced Mainstream Provision Schools to plan placements annually. Forecasts are made through assessing the SEND cohort

prior to transition, in year transfers are planned through individual responses to each child. Durham County Council commissioned 1,622 Special School in September 2023. It is known that each of these places were taken by identified pupils. Recognising that there is an annual increase in the volume of specialist provision we are currently undertaking a review of High Needs provision. This review will include research into the number of pupils with Education Health and Care Plans and the level of need identified within them to enable an accurate assessment of those pupils who will require places in Special Schools at Key Stage, 1, Key Stage 2 and Year 7.

- There are 4,224 active EHCPs at the end of 2022 (a rise of 33% since growth 2019)
- There has been an increase of 68% in EHCP requests (972) requests in 2022 compared to 2019, greater than NE +36% and Eng + 39% over the same period
- In 2022 Durham issued 603 EHCPs an increase of 79% since 2019, again greater than regional (+39%) and Eng (+27%)
- 42% of all young people with an EHCP in Durham are Educated in a Special School compared to 33% in Eng.
- Durham also has 30.1% of young people with an EHCP in a mainstream school compared to 40.1% in the rest of the country.
- Durham has increased Maintained Special School places by 12% from 1420 to 1584 since 2019.
- The increase in Special School places is lower than the demand which is placing pressure on Specialist Provision.
- We continue to look at ways we can safely expand our Special School places to meet the demand.

### **Early Years Provision**

Early Years education in County Durham is delivered by a variety of providers - Local Authority Nursery Schools, Nursery Units attached to Primary Schools and Private and Voluntary Providers (Including childminders).

Annex 5 (pages 46-51) provides details of nursery schools and Private and Voluntary Providers and the places they have available.
