

Welcome to your library!

Durham County Council's libraries offer **free** access to:

- Thousands of books
- Bookable computers with internet access, WIFI
- e-magazines, e-books, e-audiobooks and lots more



How to join

- Joining the library is free for everyone. All you need to provide is one proof of identity which includes your address, such as an electricity bill.
- You may borrow up to twelve books and a maximum of six audio books for a period of three weeks.
- If you don't have proof with you we can still issue a temporary library card so that you can borrow up to three books and use the computer.
- Your library card gives you access to all of the services available at your library so please remember to bring it with you each time you visit. Any lost cards can be easily replaced for a small fee.

What can I expect when I join?

This leaflet will help you to get the most from your visit. Please don't forget that staff are always on hand to help. Notice boards and digital screens provide up to date information on special events and activities – ranging from arts and craft sessions to reading groups. Each library also has a Health Zone with books and information on healthy lifestyle choices.

Books

- Each library has a wide range of books on their shelves.
- Books on the library catalogue can also be reserved for you for a small fee. In fact we can access almost any library in the country to try and find what you're looking for! So, if you are looking for something specific, by a particular author, or need some inspiration of what to read next, just ask a member of staff who will be pleased to help. They will contact you as soon as the book becomes available for collection.
- If you want to renew your library books you can also do so in person, by telephone or online. Books can be returned to any County Durham library and we can also remind you of the due date by email. Don't forget to sign up for this service.

Computers and internet access

- Computer access is free for library members and sessions can be booked in person, by phone or online.
- The computer can be used for up to one hour, which can be extended if no one else is waiting.
- All computers have a range of software and printers and scanners are also available for use.
- As well as the Library Online facility, library computers also give you free access to research and information sites such as:
Ancestry.co.uk – the largest online collection of family history records in the UK; online reference sites such as Who's Who and Encyclopaedia Britannica.
- You will also be able to access the full range of e-books, e-audiobooks and e-magazines.

There are no age restrictions on use but we have the following safeguards in place. Parents/guardians can withdraw permission for their child under 18 to use a computer (notification letters are sent out when anyone under 18 uses a computer for the first time). We also recommend that younger children be accompanied when using computers as Durham County Council and its staff cannot accept responsibility for children's use of the internet in the library.
