### SEMH Needs - Why do we need to meet them?

- Social, emotional and mental health needs are common in both primary and secondary school
- 16.1% of primary pupils and 19.2% of secondary pupils on SEN support have SEMH identified as their **primary** type of need (DfE, 2016).
- These rates are increasing (Collishaw et al., 2010).
- Many more students are likely to have SEMH needs that are secondary to other types of SEND, and will require support.
