Introduction

Portfolio Holder Statement

As the Cabinet portfolio holder for Economy and Partnerships I am happy to say that the overview of the Area Action Partnerships falls under my remit.

Over the last 13 years AAPs have helped local community organisations to thrive through practical support and funding. 2022/23 has been no different. The 14 AAPs across County Durham have helped to fund over 230 projects through their Area Budgets allocating £2.6m to these good causes. This is making a massive difference when like the rest of us, local organisations are being adversely impacted by the continued long term impacts of the Covid pandemic and the cost of living crisis.

County Durham is a diverse place, and each AAP is led and directed by local people, councillors, and partners. This means they can adapt to local circumstances whether they be in Wingate or Westgate, Castleside or Coxhoe. This local engagement means AAPs are firmly rooted in, and valued by their communities.

Throughout County Durham AAP funding has supported a wide variety of projects including, youth work, mental health support, environmental projects, activities for older people, sports clubs, children's play, village halls and community centres, parish councils, community safety initiatives and employment schemes, just to name a few.

The AAPs also support myself and my fellow councillors in allocating our annual Neighbourhood Budget. The 126 County Councillors have allocated over £2.2m to over 820 local projects in County Durham over the past year, again supporting a wide range of local schemes.

As with any service, it is always good practice to consider if any improvements can be made. Having remained largely unchanged for the last 14 years, the need for an independent view as to how the service might be enhanced led to the recently completed community engagement review. While consultation is still ongoing on the proposals contained in the review, it comes as no surprise that the consultants found many strengths of the AAPs that we could build upon in the future.

None of this would be possible without the dedication of AAP Boards, fellow councillors, partner organisations, members of the public and the AAP staff. So, thank you one and all. The AAPs would not be the success they have been without your continued support.

Welcome from the Chair

Graham Easterlow

It is my absolute pleasure to have served as the Chair of the EDAAP for the first year without Covid restrictions. I have welcomed being able to meet up in person with colleagues and communities, sometimes for the first time. In the Chair, my intention has been to reconnect us as a team of dedicated and diverse people, hold collaborative space so we can work together in addressing the needs of our communities today while also looking forward to what opportunities there are to address the challenges of tomorrow.

Together our AAP has made grants of £784,231.55.

These grants have funded vital projects and activities including the school holiday 'Fun and Food' activities, activities to support Healthy Relationships for young people, activities to help keep vulnerable households safe through our Safer Homes scheme and innovative projects to address ASB through the delivery of mechanics activities for targeted young people.

We have also looked ahead in trying to address future challenges such as the climate crisis.

This included Green Grant support for our community buildings in making much-needed adaptations to help them with energy efficiency instigated by the Maintaining Social Fabric of our Community group alongside direct support for our vital community buildings with their ever-increasing energy bills.

The newly formed Towns and Villages group assisted the AAP Board to distribute £210,000 of place-based regeneration money. This helped to support four under resourced villages with £80,000 for truly place based regeneration schemes, providing £26,000 of additional capital for the Green Grants Scheme and investing over £60k into activities to reconnect the wonderful East Durham Coast with our local towns and villages with new walking and cycling routes.

This year also saw Durham County Council undertake a review of the AAP's across the county. This is the first time in 14 years that a review has taken place and it is pleasing to note that the independent consultant highlighted many strengths within the AAP's. It is also clear that there has been a strong response to many of the recommendations proposed in this report. I hope that these strengths form the foundation on which genuine evolution of the AAP's takes place, rather than the deconstruction of well-established and effective community engagement and action oriented development undertaken over the last decade.

I would like to thank the AAP team for all their continued hard work throughout the last year, their dedication and hard work on behalf of our communities make a real difference in ensuring our community can meet, discuss and take action on a range of issues that matter to them.

I would also like to thank every member of the AAP Board and its thematic groups. Each person who has attended and offered up their time has helped to ensure the AAP has fulfilled its aims and upheld the support and development of the communities of East Durham.



Our People

Anyone who lives, works, studies or volunteers in the area can get involved with the Area Action Partnership. We currently have 900 people who are part of our wider Forum who receive regular updates and who are invited to get involved in the work of the AAP.

The Difference We Have Made



The Warm Welcome Café

Funded by Neighbourhood Budget, Peterlee Town Council launched The Warm Welcome Café in March 2023 at Shotton Hall Banqueting Suites, Peterlee offering low-cost meals to all members of the community. People can sit in the venue or take meals home all for a very reasonable price. The Neighbourhood Budget funded new kitchen equipment and food costs to support the start-up of the project and help people afford home cooked meals during the country's cost of living crisis.

The group have been exceeding targets and have on average 50 people buying from there each week. The Warm Welcome Café also offers a warm place to be and socialise and help reduce the impact of social isolation.

The project is run by volunteers from the community who prepare and cook the food and then wait on and serve the customers every Tuesday 9-2pm.



Landscaping for Artillery Heritage and Visitor Attraction

Using funding from the Members' Towns and Villages fund the Community Economic Development Team at Durham County Council have installed a 5.5 inch medium gun onto the seafront in Seaham.

Seaham has a long history of association with the Royal Artillery dating from 1859 with the formation of a unit of Seaham artillery volunteers. Gun batteries have existed on the sea front in Seaham to defend the coast from invasion since the 1860s.

The gun was purchased and restored using Members Towns and Villages Fund and is similar to the guns stationed at Seaham during the Second World War that were subsequently used on active service in the Burma campaign.



Open Water Swimming

Adventure Access CiC, based at the Marina in Seaham, received Neighbourhood Budget funding for an introductory course for residents of Deneside.

There is a growing interest in open water swimming in Seaham and the wider area and the course was designed for complete beginners who may be interested in open water swimming but who lack the confidence and knowledge to carry out the activity safely. In total 30 people took part in the course.

The Difference We Have Made



Peterlee Youth Club - Groundwork

Groundwork have launched a new Youth Group held in Peterlee at Oakerside Community Centre every Tuesday evening 6pm - 8pm funded by the Neighbourhood Budget to deliver youth work sessions in the area. They have 12 young people already registered but are hoping to increase these numbers as the weeks go by.

Over the weeks they have been planning future youth sessions around the needs of the young people and Groundwork have made two referrals to the thrive gym sessions offered by Durham County Council for 11–15-year-olds.

Other sessions offer sexual health advice and cover C-Card delivery and an 8–10-week sexual health workshop called 'out the box' has begun, covering all things health and well-being and their sexual health needs.

Groundwork link in with other youth providers such as Durham City Youth Project who are also delivering a detached session in Peterlee and have been signposting young people to the community centre.

Within the Youth Project, the group have been playing sports and general games within the centre and placed a large screen TV on the wall for the young people to access. The young people have also participated in multiple cooking sessions where they have used the kitchen facilities in the centre to bake cakes and make other sweets treats.

The group have started a key fund project with the regular attendees where they have chosen to go karting, which is a new experience for them. A panel was held with the help of Durham City Youth Project and alongside them, Groundwork are creating links with local secondary schools to help increase numbers.



Holiday Activities with Healthy Food

Over the course of the 2022/2023 school year the East Durham AAP administered £210,614.15 of Holiday Activities with Healthy Food funding through the Children and Young People Priority Group.

Over the school holiday periods 111 projects were delivered across the AAP area. In total 6,814 children attended across the year
