The County Council of Durham (West View, Esh Winning; High Street to Low Road, Shincliffe; Walden Close, Urpeth; Dene Park, Esh Winning; Riverside Wolsingham; C84 Beamish, High Handenhold) (Temporary Road Closure) Order 2024

The Council on 29/5/2024 made the above Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984 as amended, Section 14 (1) to prohibit all vehicular traffic from proceeding on West View, Esh Winning in its entirety south of C18a, High Street and Low Road, Shincliffe extending west and north from its junction with A177 to the junction with St Marys Close, and extending south and east from A177, Walden Close, Urpeth in its entirety from its junction with St Benets Way, Dene Park, Esh Winning in its entirety extending north west from its junction with Birch Place, Riverside Wolsingham in its entirety extending east from its junction with The Causeway, C84 Beamish, High Handenhold extending for 2.04 km between A693 at High Handenhold to the junction with the road to Beamish Museum to enable carriageway micro-asphalt surfacing and surface dressing works to be undertaken. The restrictions will be applied by appropriate signs per site as required and be typically required for a window of up to 10 days per location. Diversions will be signed on site where available and required. The maximum duration of the Order is 18 months. The proposed works are to commence from or after Monday 10/6/2024 and are anticipated to be completed in 3-4 months. On occasions, alternative dates for closure may be necessary and these will be signed accordingly.
