THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF DURHAM (WALDRIDGE) (PROHIBITION OF PARKING AND WAITING RESTRICTIONS) ORDER 2023

The Council on 30/10/2024 made an Order under Sections 1, 2, 4, and part four of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 "the Act"), as amended, the effect of which comes into operation on 14/11/2024 and will **To introduce 'no waiting at any time' restrictions: a.** On the western side of the 'C91 to Cedar Street (Back)', starting on Waldridge Road from the boundary of No.16 and No.17 Chester Street, for a distance of 157m in a south-easterly direction b. the eastern side of the 'C91 to Cedar Street (Back)', starting on Waldridge Road from a point 13m west of the boundary between Brackenfell Cottage and Claremont House, for a distance of 127m in a south-easterly direction c, the eastern side of the 'C91 to Cedar Street (Back)', starting from the boundary between No.11 and No.12 Olive Street, for a distance of 22m in a south-easterly direction d. the northern side of Chester Street (Back), starting from its junction with the 'C91 to Cedar Street (Back)', for a distance of 4.5m in a westerly direction e. the southern side of Chester Street (Back), starting from its junction with the 'C91 to Cedar Street (Back)', for a distance of 5m in a westerly direction f. both sides of Poplar Street, starting from the eastern boundary of No.17 Poplar Street, for a distance of 4.5m in a westerly direction **g.** both sides of Poplar Street, starting from the western boundary of No.18 Poplar Street, for a distance of 4.5m in an easterly direction h. both sides of Lime Street, starting from the eastern boundary of No.11 Lime Street, for a distance of 4.5m in a westerly direction i. both sides of Lime Street, starting from the western boundary of No.12 Lime Street, for a distance of 4.5m in an easterly direction **J.** the northern side of Cedar Street, starting from its junction with the 'C91 to Cedar Street (Back)', for a distance of 4.5m in an easterly direction. A copy of the Order and supporting documents can be seen via the Council website, and at Chester-Le-Street Library during normal opening hours. Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by "the Act", as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any regulation made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks from 7/11/2024.

The County Council of Durham ("the Council") in exercise of their powers under Sections 1, 2 and 4, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby make the following Order:-

Part 1

General

1. This Order may be cited as The County Council of Durham (Waldridge) (Prohibition of Parking and Waiting Restrictions) Order 2023 and shall come into operation on Day 14th of November 2024.

Interpretation

- 2. In this Order the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:-
 - "civil enforcement officer" means a person authorised by or on behalf of the Council pursuant to the provisions of Section 76 of the Traffic Management Act 2004.
 - "disabled person's badge" and "disabled person's parking disc" have the same meaning as in the Disabled Person's (Badge's for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 (as amended);
 - "enforcement officer" means a uniformed police officer, police community support officer or any subsequent designation of these officers;
 - "motor vehicle" means a mechanically propelled vehicle intended or adapted for use on roads, as defined in Section 136 of the Act;
 - "parking contravention" has the same meaning assigned to it by Section 73 and Part 1 of Schedule 7 to the Traffic Management Act 2004;
 - "penalty charge" means a charge set by the Council under the provisions of section 77 of the Traffic Management Act 2004, as amended, in accordance with the relevant statutory regulations or guidance given by the Secretary of State for Transport;
 - "penalty charge notice" means a notice issued by a civil enforcement officer pursuant to the provisions of section 78 of the Traffic Management Act 1978, as amended;
 - "relevant position" has the same meaning as defined by The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;
 - "universal service provider" has the same meaning as in the Postal Services Act 2000:
- 3. Except where the context requires otherwise, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article shall be construed as a reference to the Article bearing that number in this Order.
- 4. Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect

by virtue of any subsequent enactment. Unless the context otherwise requires words denoting the singular shall include the plural and vice versa and words denoting persons shall include either gender, bodies corporate, unincorporated associations and partnerships.

5. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order.

Part II

Prohibition of Waiting

7. Save as provided in Article 9 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of an enforcement officer, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on any of the lengths of roads or sides of lengths of roads identified within the individual plans detailed in Schedule 1 to this Order.

Part III

Exemptions

- Nothing in Articles 7 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit
 any vehicle to wait on any of the lengths of roads or sides of lengths of roads
 referred to within the appropriate Schedules, for so long as may be necessary
 to enable;
 - (a) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following:-
 - (i) building or demolition;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or re-construction of the said roads;
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or maintenance in or in land adjacent to the said lengths of roads of any sewer, main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - (b) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road to be used in the service of a local authority or water authority in pursuance of statutory duties;
 - (c) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets in the service of a universal service provider.
 - (2) Nothing in Articles 7 of this Order shall apply to any vehicle being used for police, fire & rescue service or ambulance purposes in pursuance of statutory duties.
 - (3) Nothing in Article 7 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and disabled person's parking disc (on which the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to

wait in any of the lengths of road or on the sides of road referred to in that Article for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same road on the same day).

Part IV

Contravention and Enforcement

- 10. If a vehicle is in contravention of a provision of this Order a penalty charge shall be payable.
- 11. In the case of a vehicle in respect of which a penalty charge is payable, a penalty charge notice may then be issued by a Civil Enforcement Officer in accordance with the requirements of Section 78 of the Traffic Management Act 2004, as amended.

Part V

Saving

- 12. In so for as any provision of this Order conflicts with any provision which is contained in an Order made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment then the provisions of this Order shall prevail.
- 13. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.




Prohibition of Waiting

7. Part III

Exemptions

- 9. (1) Nothing in Articles 7 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on any of the lengths of roads or sides of lengths of roads referred to within the appropriate Schedules, for so long as may be necessary to enable;
 - (a) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following:-
 - (i) building or demolition;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or re-construction of the said roads;
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or maintenance in or in land adjacent to the said lengths of roads of any sewer, main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984:
 - (b) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road to be used in the service of a local authority or water authority in pursuance of statutory duties;
 - the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets in the service of a universal service provider.
 - (2) Nothing in Articles 7 of this Order shall apply to any vehicle being used for police, fire & rescue service or ambulance purposes in pursuance of statutory duties.
 - (3) Nothing in Article 7 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and disabled person's parking disc (on which the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to



wait in any of the lengths of road or on the sides of road referred to in that Article for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same road on the same day).

Part IV

Contravention and Enforcement

- 10. If a vehicle is in contravention of a provision of this Order a penalty charge shall be payable.
- 11. In the case of a vehicle in respect of which a penalty charge is payable, a penalty charge notice may then be issued by a Civil Enforcement Officer in accordance with the requirements of Section 78 of the Traffic Management Act 2004, as amended.

Part V

Saving

- 12. In so for as any provision of this Order conflicts with any provision which is contained in an Order made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment then the provisions of this Order shall prevail.
- 13. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.






