THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF DURHAM (PUBLIC PATH NO. 9 CORNSAY PARISH) PUBLIC FOOTPATH CREATION AND DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT MODIFICATION ORDER 2022

On 25 October 2024, The County Council of Durham confirmed the above order made under section 26 of the Highways Act 1980.

The effect of the order as confirmed is to create a public footpath No. 9 Cornsay Parish running from its current southern termination point on the current route of Footpath No.1, proceeding in a generally south-south-easterly direction to a point on the new route of Footpath No. 1, as shown on the order map. The above order will also modify the Definitive Map and Statement of the Public Rights of Way for County Durham by deleting and adding the footpath described.

A copy of the order and the order map have been placed and may be seen free of charge at the at Esh Winning library during normal opening hours and via the Council website.

The order comes into force as from 25 October 2024, but if any person aggrieved by the order wants to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the order, he or she may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 of the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 of the Act, within six weeks from 31 October 2024 make an application to the High Court.

This order is also made under section 53A(2) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 ("the 1981 Act") because it appears to the authority that the County Durham Definitive Map and Statement require modification in consequence of the occurrence of an event specified in section 53(3)(a)(iii) of the 1981 Act, namely, the creation (as authorised by this order) of a new right of way over land in the area to which the map relates, being a right of way such that the land over which the right subsists is a public path.

The authorities have been consulted as required by section 26(3) of the 1980 Act.

BY THIS ORDER:

There shall be at the end of 7 days from the date of confirmation of this order a public footpath over the land at Cornsay House Farm described in Part 1 of the Schedule to this order and shown by a bold broken line on the map attached to this order, and thereupon the Definitive Map and Statement of Public Rights of Way for County Durham shall be modified as described in Part 2 of the Schedule to this order.


