# **Statement of Reasons**

Durham County Council as Highway Authority propose to make the above order in discharge of its duty under Section 122 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, "to secure the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of vehicular and other traffic (including pedestrians)", in accordance with the provisions of Section 1(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 namely:-

- (a) for avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising, or
- (b) for preventing damage to the road or to any building on or near the road, or
- (c) for facilitating the passage on the road or any other road of any class of traffic (including pedestrians), or
- (d) for preventing the use of the road by vehicular traffic of a kind which, or its use by vehicular traffic in a manner which, is unsuitable having regard to the existing character of the road or adjoining property, or
- (e) (without prejudice to the generality of paragraph(d) above) for preserving the character of the road in a case where it is specially suitable for use by persons on horseback or on foot, or
- (f) for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which the road runs; or
- (g) For any of the purposes specified in paragraphs (a) to (c) of subsection (1) of section 87 of the Environment Act 1995 (air quality).

# Part I

# **1.Commencement and Citation**

This Order may be cited as The County Council of Durham (Durham City) (Road User Charging Scheme) Order 2014 (Amendment No.1) Order 2024 and shall come into force on day of 20.

# 2. Amendments

# Purpose of Amendments

The following brief synopsis of amendments should be viewed in conjunction with the plan identified within the Schedule 1 to the above Order.

# **Interpretation**

The following definitions have been amended as follows:

"charging day" has been amended by inserting Boxing day and removing a Sunday, Good Friday and any other day which is a Bank Holiday in England and Wales under the Banking and Financial Dealings Act 1971 to read as follows;

# "charging day" means any day of the year except:

- (a) Christmas Day
- (b) Boxing Day
- (c) New Year's Day

"charging hours" has been amended removing 4pm and replacing it with 2 am to read as follows;

# "charging hours" means the hours between 10.00am and 2am on a charging day;

#### **Articles**

Article 11(a) Daily Charge (1) has been amended removing £2.00 and replacing it with £5.00 to read as follows:

(1) Save as provided by Article 10 of this Order, any vehicle used or kept on a designated road within the charging area on any charging day during any part of the charging hours shall be subject to a daily charge of £5.00. Such a daily charge may be varied in accordance with Part III, Chapter I, Section 170 of the 2000 Act.

#### Saving

- 3. (1) Insofar as any provision of this Order conflicts with any provision which is contained in an Order made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment then the provisions of this Order shall prevail.
  - (2) The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or any other enactment.
